Re:	Batting Cage Installation - Fund 46

Background

During the 2018-2019 school year, the Ripon Area School District (RASD) established a Long-Term Capital Improvement Trust Fund (Fund 46) to finance costly facilities projects. Over the past six school years, savings have been allocated to this fund to increase General Fund (Fund 10) expenditures, thereby maximizing general state aid and lowering property taxes.

A key requirement of Fund 46 is that deposits cannot be accessed for five years after the fund's inception. In April 2024, Fund 46 matured and was used for the first time to finance a middle school roofing project. The current fund balance is \$2,436,357; however, previously approved projects awaiting installation will reduce this balance. A detailed summary of revenues and expenditures is provided on the final page of this memo.

Ripon High School Batting Cages

Administrators propose the installation of two new batting cages at the east end of the high school gym. These batting cages would be mechanically operated, allowing them to be raised and lowered from the ceiling as needed.

Currently, baseball and softball teams share a single batting cage located in the middle school's upper gym. This setup presents challenges related to scheduling and supervision. Installing two batting cages in the high school gym would centralize practice locations for these teams.

The existing middle school batting cage will remain in place, providing an additional option for youth teams or as a backup when high school gym space is unavailable.

Funding

Funding for the project would come from three sources. New High School Softball Coach Bob Bruce has raised \$10,000 for this project, and the Athletic department will use \$5,000 of donated funds. Both amounts will be spent from Fund 21. The rest of the project will be funded by Fund 46 - roughly \$15,115.

Next Steps

Administrators recommend partnering with H & B Specialized Products for the material and installation of the batting changes. Electrical work will be completed by Kaufman Electric. Ordering now should allow for use of these batting cages this school year. We look forward to discussing this project further at your convenience.
